NEW TESTAMENT LETTER 1 John 4: 20-21

Those who say, "I love God," and hate their sisters or brothers, are liars; for those who do not love a brother or sister whom they have seen, cannot love God whom they have not seen. The commandment we have from God is this: those who love God must love their sisters and brothers also.

GOSPEL READING John 15:1-8

I am the true vine, and my Father-Mother is the vinegrower. God removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit God prunes to make it bear more fruit. You have already been cleansed by the word that I have spoken to you. Abide in me as I abide in you. Our intentions are to present the worship service on April 28, 2024 in hybrid format; those attending in person should remain in the sanctuary for the vote. Those attending through Zoom should remain on Zoom for the vote. In order to take action on this item, a combined quorum of 40 members must be present.

Voting will take place by unanimous consent:

- If there are no objections, motions are passed unanimously.
- If someone objects, an actual vote will be taken.
